

About the OSAA

The OSAA is comprised of 290 member high schools representing more than 200 Oregon communities. A private non-profit, board-governed association, the OSAA is sanctioned by the Oregon State Board of Education and is a member of the National Federation of State High School Associations (NFHS).

It's History

The OSAA began in 1918 when administrators from 36 schools recognized a need for an organization to coordinate and regulate high school interscholastic competition. Thus the Oregon State High School Athletic Association was formed. The name was changed in 1947 to reflect the inclusion of activities outside of traditional athletics.

Mission Statement

The mission of the OSAA is to serve member schools by providing leadership and state coordination for the conduct of interscholastic activities, which will enrich the educational experiences of high school students. The OSAA will work to promote interschool activities that provide equitable participation opportunities, positive recognition and learning experiences to students, while enhancing the achievement of educational goals.

What the OSAA Does

Much like the NCAA at the collegiate level, the OSAA regulates the eligibility and competition of all high school students in the state. This includes everything from determining which league a school will compete in to sponsoring and administering state championships.

Funding

As a private, non-profit organization, the OSAA does not receive any state funding. Revenue is generated from three sources: school membership fees, state championship gate receipts and corporate sponsors.

OSAA Activities

The OSAA sponsors 113 team and 426 individual event state championships for students competing in 19 interscholastic activities:

STATE CHAMPIONSHIP DIRECTOR/DAVE SIME: Dave Sime has been involved with high school bands in Oregon for 42 years. He retired in the spring of 2016 from the Redmond School District. He taught high school band for 34 years. Thirty of those years were in the Redmond School District, the last four at Ridgeview High School. He has also taught in Lakeview and Ione. His main teaching duties involved Wind Ensemble, Symphonic Bands and Jazz Bands. He has also taught a Mariachi class and IB Music. His Bands performed at the Oregon Music Educators Conference and throughout the west coast, including Canada. His bands won their league contest 15 times, winning their division of the OSAA State Championships once, and were runner-up three times. Dave has also been active with the Oregon Ambassadors of Music, having gone on 7 trips through Europe with some of Oregon's finest high school musicians. He received the Outstanding Music Educator award in 2017. He is a member of OMEA, the Oregon Band Directors Association, and the Northwest Bandmasters Association. In his free time, he enjoys golf and loves playing with his twin grandkids.

ADJUDICATORS

JOHN CARNAHAN: John Alan Carnahan is Professor Emeritus at the Bob Cole Conservatory of Music at California State University, Long Beach. He served as the Director of Bands and Professor of Conducting for thirty-four years, and as the Director of the Conservatory for twelve of those years. Prior to his appointment at Long Beach Professor Carnahan served as the Associate Director of Bands at the University of Texas, Arlington, and Director of Bands at Clovis High School, in Clovis, California. Professor Carnahan brings a broad-based knowledge and extensive background to all idioms of instrumental music performance. His ensembles have performed at numerous regional, national, and international music festivals and conferences including the Music Educators National Conference, the College Band Directors National Association Regional and National Conferences, the American Bandmasters Association National Conference, the featured ensemble at the Korean International Wind Band Festival in Seoul, Korea, and the University of Hertfordshire Music Festival in London, England.

In addition to his university duties, Professor Carnahan is active internationally as a guest conductor, adjudicator, clinician, lecturer, author, and composer/arranger. He has conducted countless honor ensemble performances at the local, regional, national, and international levels. He served as a visiting professor at Hanyang University in Seoul, Korea and conducted acclaimed performances at the Seoul Arts Center Theater. He also conducted concerts featuring The Boston Brass, Jens Lindemann, Patrick Sheridan, Eric Marienthal, Jim Walker, and worked as a music/performance consultant with the nationally renowned *Dallas Brass*. Professor Carnahan is a sought-after rehearsal clinician. He has presented numerous performance demonstrations for notable national and international music education conferences including the Midwest Band and Orchestra Clinic in Chicago, Il, and the World Association for Symphonic Bands and Ensembles International Conference in Utrecht, Netherlands. His innovative and thought-provoking sessions on ensemble rehearsal techniques and the art of conducting are consistently well received. Professor Carnahan holds membership in the College Band Directors National Association, where he serves as a Past President of the Western Division, The World Association for Symphonic Bands and Ensembles, Life-Member of the Southern California School Band and Orchestra Association and honored with membership in the American Bandmasters Association in 2013.

PATRICK WINTERS: Patrick Winters recently retired as the Director of Bands and Professor of Music at Eastern Washington University where he conducted the EWU Wind Ensemble, taught conducting, and courses in music education. Mr. Winters combines his broad experience as a university conductor and teacher with his experience as a successful high school director. His high school ensembles in Virginia and California achieved an impressive record of competitive and festival performances, as well as tours through the eastern and western United States, Canada, Mexico and Japan. Mr. Winters established a band program at Eastern Washington University that is one of the finest and most active in the Northwest. Concert, marching and jazz groups regularly perform throughout the Northwest United States and Western Canada. His EWU Wind Ensemble's compact discs CELEBRATIONS and DANCES, SONGS & CELEBRATIONS have received wide acclaim. The group can also be heard on SOUNDSCAPES, PRISMS and MILLENIUM CD, the EWU Music Department's three compact discs. In 1994, Mr. Winters received the PTI Outstanding Faculty Award for excellence in teaching. In 1998, he was awarded the Washington Music Educator's Association Outstanding Music Educator Award. In 2000, he was inducted into the W.M.E.A. Hall of Fame. Mr. Winters' article Building Ensemble Musicianship For Your Concert Band appears in "Spotlight On Teaching Band," published by M.E.N.C.

Mr. Winters holds a Bachelor of Music Education degree from Elon University and a Master of Music Education degree from California State University. Mr. Winters is in demand throughout the country as a guest conductor, clinician and adjudicator, having appeared in 16 states and 5 foreign countries. Patrick lives in Spokane, Washington with his wife Joyce. They have three grown children Brittany, Danica, and Zach.

ROBERT BELSER: Robert Belser, Professor of Music, is the Director of Bands at the University of Wyoming and conductor of the UW Wind Symphony, Symphonic Band, and Community Concert Band. A native of Lee's Summit, Missouri, he earned the Bachelor of Music Education degree from Central Missouri State University (now the University of Central Missouri) and taught public school instrumental and choral music in central Missouri. Belser served as a graduate teaching assistant at the University of Illinois where he studied with Harry Begian, Gary Smith, and Dan Perantoni, and earned the Master of Science in Music Education degree. He was Assistant Director of Bands at Eastern Kentucky University and served as Director of Bands at Southwestern Oklahoma State University, Bob was awarded the Doctor of Musical Arts in Conducting from The University of lowa where he was a student of Myron Welch. His conducting and teaching has also been greatly influenced through conducting symposia with Craig Kirchhoff, John Paynter, and Mallory Thompson. Belser is in demand as a clinician and conductor at conferences and All-States throughout the country, in Canada, and Western Europe. Under his baton, the UW Wind Symphony has become noted for musical performances and brings masterworks and innovative repertory to campus audiences, and twice has performed for the prestigious Western/Northwestern Division conference of College Band Directors National Association. Belser is also the conductor of the Wyoming Ambassadors of Music Concert Band, and Tour Director for their bi-annual tours of Europe. He is a contributing author for chapters for the "Teaching Musicianship Through Performance in Band" series of texts. In his leadership of the UW Bands, the program has grown to include three concert bands, annual chamber concert series of a faculty-student wind ensemble, the 180-strong Western Thunder Marching Band, and two UW Pep Bands, as well as maintaining and growing a loyal donor base for the band program. Belser served nationally on the Board of the Northwest Division of College Band Directors National Conference. In addition to conducting, Bob also teaches the music education courses in theory, music history, brass methods, plus graduate conducting and literature courses. Among his awards are the prestigious John P. "Jack" Ellbogen Award for Meritorious Classroom teaching in, "Warming the Chill" Award for promoting and maintaining positive classroom teaching in an atmosphere of respect for diversity, the Lee's Summit High School Hall of Fame, "Top Prof" at the University of Wyoming, and three times named a Top 10 Teacher in the College of Arts and Sciences. He was also awarded the 2009 Distinguished Alumnus, nominated by the Department of Music, at his alma mater, the University of Central Missouri.

JOHN BELL: Dr. John Bell is Professor of Music Emeritus from Southern Illinois University Edwardsville, where he served as Director of Bands and Professor of Conducting and Music Education for 30 years. Previous appointments include Associate Director of Bands at the University of Northern Colorado, and band director at Willowbrook and Rolling Meadows High Schools in the Chicago suburbs. He currently is serving as the director of the Wind Ensemble at McKendree University, in Lebanon, Illinois, and the music and artistic director for the St. Louis Brass Band, in St. Louis, Missouri. He is an elected member of the North American Brass Band Association Board, where his responsibilities have been focused on developing a modern, empirically based adjudication system for their national and regional championships. Ensembles under his direction have been selected for performance at the international conference of the World Association for Symphonic Bands and Ensembles in Chiayi City, Taiwan; the national convention of the Music Educators National Conference (now NAfME); divisional conferences of the Southwest and North-Central College Band Directors National Association; the state conferences of the Illinois Music Educators and Colorado Music Educators; and twice in New York City's Carnegie Hall. The SIUE Wind Symphony mounted eight recording projects under his direction, with all recordings available on the Mark Masters label. He served as brass caption head for the Cavaliers and the Blue Knights drum and bugle corps. An elected member of the prestigious American Bandmasters Association, he has been an invited clinician and adjudicator throughout the United States, Japan, Thailand, the Taiwan (ROC), and Canada. He has conducted all-state and honor bands in Europe, Taiwan (ROC), Washington, Colorado, Tennessee, Illinois, Missouri, Kentucky, Nebraska, California, Wisconsin and Georgia, and has studied conducting with L. Bruce Jones, Harry Begian, James Keene and Kenneth Singleton. He resides in Lebanon, Illinois, with his spouse, Dr. Jennifer Moder-Bell and their pup, Wiggles, an extremely bossy Cavalier King Charles.
