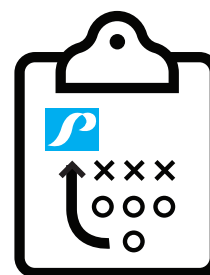

## About the OSAA

The OSAA is comprised of 290 member high schools representing more than 200 Oregon communities. A private non-profit, board-governed association, the OSAA is sanctioned by the Oregon State Board of Education and is a member of the National Federation of State High School Associations (NFHS).

## It's History

The OSAA began in 1918 when administrators from 36 schools recognized a need for an organization to coordinate and regulate high school interscholastic competition. Thus the Oregon State High School Athletic Association was formed. The name was changed in 1947 to reflect the inclusion of activities outside of traditional athletics.

## Mission Statement

The mission of the OSAA is to serve member schools by providing leadership and state coordination for the conduct of interscholastic activities, which will enrich the educational experiences of high school students. The OSAA will work to promote interschool activities that provide equitable participation opportunities, positive recognition and learning experiences to students, while enhancing the achievement of educational goals.

## What the OSAA Does

Much like the NCAA at the collegiate level, the OSAA regulates the eligibility and competition of all high school students in the state. This includes everything from determining which league a school will compete in to sponsoring and administering state championships.

## Funding

As a private, non-profit organization, the OSAA does not receive any state funding. Revenue is generated from three sources: school membership fees, state championship gate receipts and corporate sponsors.

## OSAA Activities

The OSAA sponsors 113 team and 426 individual event state championships for students competing in 19 interscholastic activities:

Cheerleading, Wrestling, Swimming, Basketball, Dance/Drill

## STATE CHAMPIONSHIP ASSISTANT DIRECTOR

**DR. MATTHEW L. STRAUER** is a retired Oregon choral music educator. He has taught at Corban University, Oregon State University, Santiam Christian Schools, and at Charlo, Montana. He earned his Bachelor of Music Education degree from the University of Montana in Missoula (he also earned a Bachelor's in Geology at UM) and a Master of Arts in New Testament Studies from Wheaton College Graduate School. He earned a Doctorate of Musical Arts in Music Education and Choral conducting at the University of Oregon. He is past president of Oregon ACDA. Matt has always been involved in church music. He is the worship pastor at Keizer Community Church. Matt promotes sight singing as a presenter, adjudicator and clinician. For other interests, Matt enjoys hiking, mountaineering, rock climbing, photography, computers and family. Matt and wife Naomi reside in Salem. They have four married children and twelve grandchildren. For his "second" career, Matt is selling real estate in the Mid-Willamette Valley. Matt is thrilled to hear the wonderful choirs at the OSAA Championships.

## PERFORMANCE ADJUDICATORS

**DR. NICOLE LAMARTINE**, Director of Choirs Activities at Central Washington University, where she will act on her values of empowering the next generation of choral educators and cultivating excellence in 21st century choral performance. As a clinician and guest conductor of three international honor choirs (DoDDS Honor Choir in Germany, AMIS TTBB Honor Choir in Abu Dhabi, TAISM Festival Choir in Oman), nine All-State choirs (MN, CO, WA, OR, WY, MT, AK, KS), the 2014 NW ACDA TTBB Honor Choir, and dozens of regional honor choirs, Nicole seeks to positively impact choral musicians all over the world. An avid champion for music education, Nicole has headlined conferences of the Association for Music in International Schools (Hong Kong) and the Washington Music Educators Association. Dr. Lamartine's research focuses on rehearsal technique and anatomy and movement for conductors, and she has presented at dozens of conferences including national and regional meetings of the American Choral Directors Association, the National Collegiate Choral Organization, College Music Society, California All-State Music Conference, and the National Association of Teachers of Singing. She conducts Chor Anno with Howard Meharg (Vancouver, WA), providing an opportunity for a creative outlet as ensemble singers to choral music educators in the NW. Chor Anno performed at the 2022 NW ACDA conference. She is also the founding Artistic Director of the Santa Barbara Gay Men's Chorus, which just completed its first season.

**DR. MATTHEW MYERS**, Myers serves as associate director of choral activities and assistant professor of choral music education at WSU. He conducts the University Singers and Treble Choir and teaches courses in music education methods, conducting, and voice. He earned his DMA in choral conducting at Louisiana State University, his master's degree in choral conducting at Northern Arizona University, and his bachelor's degree in vocal performance and music education at Luther College. After completing his degree at Luther, he taught grades 6-12 choir at The American International School of Muscat in Oman. For the following five years, he worked as director of choirs and musical theatre at Boylan Catholic High School in Rockford, Illinois. In addition to conducting five choirs, he taught AP music theory, class piano, and critical thinking and coordinated a middle school choral program at four of Boylan's constituent grade schools. He has served as conductor of the NAU Men's Chorale and Chamber Singers, the LSU Chamber Singers, the Master Chorale of Flagstaff, and the Flagstaff Youth Chorale and has held church music positions in Iowa, Illinois, Louisiana, and Alabama. Prior to his time at WSU, Dr. Myers taught at the University of Alabama, where he conducted two choirs and taught courses in music appreciation, choral literature, vocal pedagogy, and diction. He is a frequent choral clinician, guest conductor, presenter, and adjudicator. He serves as Artistic Director of the Palouse Choral Society and co-host of the Choir Fam Podcast.

**DR. JESSICA NÁPOLES**, Professor of Choral Music Education and Conductor of the Concert Choir at the University of North Texas. A native of Florida with a Cuban-American background, Dr. Nápoles taught in the

public schools of Miami and Orlando, FL. She received 3 degrees in music education from the Florida State University. Prior to her appointment at UNT, she taught at the University of Utah for 11 years.

Dr. Nápoles is an active conductor, clinician, and adjudicator, frequently engaging in guest conducting opportunities locally, regionally, and nationally. She has conducted All State and honor choirs in 17 states. Additionally, she guest conducted honor choirs for the ACDA Southern, Eastern, North Central/Central and Western regions of the American Choral Directors Association (ACDA) and was the featured conductor for the World Strides Honors Performance Series in Carnegie Hall on multiple occasions.

In addition to her work as a conductor, Dr. Nápoles is a well-known researcher, with numerous publications in prestigious journals. Her research interests center on testing pedagogical claims empirically, intonation, conducting expressivity, and teacher talk. She has served her profession through work on editorial boards (Journal of Research in Music Education, the premier journal for music education, and International Journal of Research in Choral Singing, the ACDA research journal), as Assistant Conference Chair for the national ACDA conference, Chair of the Research Standing Committee for ACDA, and lead writer for the COVID-19 task force report.

### **SIGHT READING ADJUDICATOR**

**WALLACE LONG JR**, retired in Spring 2020 from his position as director of choral/vocal activities at Willamette University in Salem, Oregon, a position he had held since 1983. Dr. Long founded the Willamette Master Chorus in 1985 and was its director for the first thirteen years of its existence. Dr. Long sang professionally with Male Ensemble Northwest and has performed as a member of the Oregon Bach Festival Chorus, and the Festival Singers of the Robert Shaw Choral Institute. Groups under his direction have performed for state conferences of the Oregon Music Educators Association, Northwestern Regional Conventions for the American Choral Directors association, national conventions of the International Association of Jazz Educators, and the Music Educators National Conference.

In the summer of 2003 his Willamette University Chamber Choir participated in a performance tour of South Africa at the request of Archbishop Desmond Tutu. In May of 2006 he conducted a 250-voice choir and professional orchestra in a performance of the Haydn's Mass in the Time of War in Carnegie Hall. Several members of the Willamette Master Chorus and Chamber Choir joined him for this special performance. A frequent vocal/choral adjudicator, clinician and guest conductor, he is an active supporter of public school music in the northwest and has conducted honor choirs in Montana, Wyoming, Kansas, Oregon, Washington, Alaska, Texas, Ireland, and Thailand.

### **TAPE POOL ADJUDICATOR**

**DR. GISELLE WYERS**, Donald E. Petersen Endowed Professor of Choral Music at the University of Washington, where she conducts the award-winning University Chorale and teaches graduate and undergraduate courses in choral conducting and music education. She serves as the newly appointed School of Music's designated Diversity Liaison. Wyers is the newly appointed director of Concord Chamber Choir, an adult community chorus within the Columbia Choirs community. Her professional project choir Solaris Vocal Ensemble, specializes in the performance of contemporary American choral literature. Wyers is a leading national figure in the application of Laban movement theory for conductors. She has served as guest lecturer in conducting at Sweden's Örebro Universitet, European Festival of Church Music (Germany), Latvian Academy of Music, Eastman School of Music, Ithaca College, Westminster Choir College, University of Iowa, Hobart and William Smith Colleges and Portland State University.

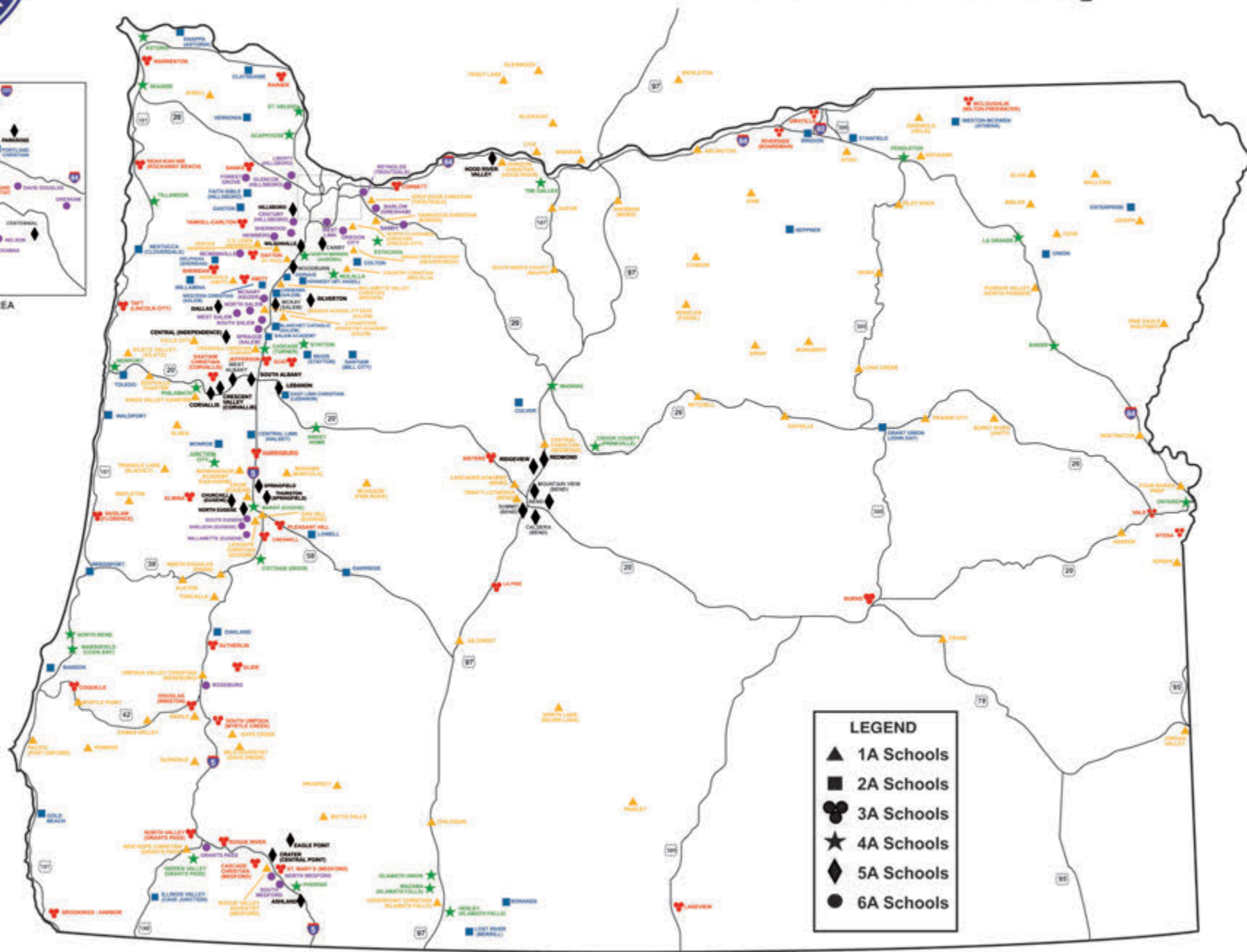

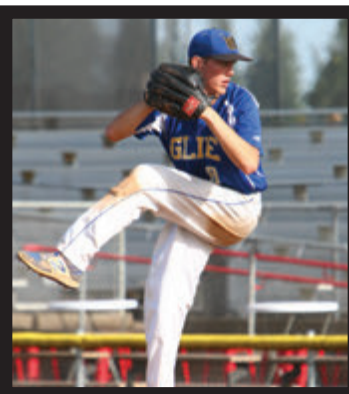
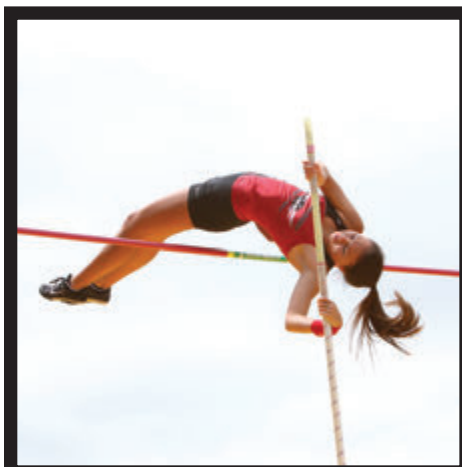

Our program opens with *O Sapientia*, a setting of an ancient text by Slovenian woman, Tadeja Vulc. The piece embodies the search for wisdom and guidance while drawing on elements of Gregorian chant as well as modern extended vocal techniques. Immediately following is Laura Mvula's *Sing To The Moon*, full of lush harmonies and a text that reflects the strength and hope that can be found amidst times of adversity. Jake Runestad's *Wild Forces*, featuring a student string quartet, closes the opening trio of pieces and joyously celebrates the powerful and untamed aspect of the human experience. This reflective setting of the *Ave Maria* text is attributed to Spanish Renaissance composer Tomas Luis de Victoria (1548-1611), though there is dispute that the work has been misattributed and was instead composed by his contemporary, Jacob Handl (1550-1591). Our set closes with *Chua-Ay*, a popular Filipino folk song arranged by Fabian Obispo. The piece depicts the Igarot tribes at work, pounding the rice by means of a huge mortar and pestle to separate the rice grains. The movements for this piece were learned from studying performances by many Filipino choirs and musicians. Additionally, *Chua-Ay* serves as a song of mourning.

*Thulele Mama Ya*, composed by Lisa Young in 2003, is sung by choirs around the world. The song is inspired by the Zulu phrase "thula mama," meaning "don't cry" or "don't worry, mama." *Kyrie: Coronation Mass in C Major K317*, composed by W.A. Mozart (1756-1791) in 1779, is the first movement of Mozart's 15th setting of the *Ordinary of the Mass*. The Latin text "Kyrie, eleison" translates to "Lord, have mercy." *Das Herz Tut Mir Aufspringen*, composed by Hans Leo Hassler (1564-1612), is a playful 16th century German madrigal detailing blossoming love and desire bursting from the heart. *If I Were a Dog*, composed by Paul John Rudoi, is a setting of the poem with the same name by Richard Shelton. This poem details the daily life and joys of a dog, and allows us to pause and reflect on the unconditional love we find from our pets and the people in our lives. *Soon-Ah Will Be Done* is a spiritual composed by William Levi Dawson (1899-1990), a renowned black composer, choir director, and professor. Dawson wrote the lyrics in the actual regional dialect with the intent of preserving and celebrating the unique quality of speech of the people in that place and time. In this setting of the text, the words going "home" or "to heaven" were an expression of yearning to escape, in life or death, and live in a free land.

*Psallite* by Michael Praetorius (1571-1621), was composed in the Renaissance period. There are no original recordings of music from this time period, thus the music can often be misunderstood and misinterpreted. *Psallite* provided an excellent opportunity for our ensemble to study Renaissance music and perform this piece with resemblance to how it would have been performed during its time. Some of the distinct features of Renaissance vocal music include: singing in keys that reveal the ethos of the music and that suit the needs or desires of the ensemble, unified vocal timbres with phrasing that is similar to natural speech, meters often in 2/2, and allowing the function of the music to determine the tempo. *Hymn of Creation* by Dan Forrest is set to an original text by Isaac Watts (1674-1749) entitled, "Sing the Mighty Power of God." Isaac was inspired to write hymns after being discouraged by the dull singing from his church congregants. His father challenged him to write something better, so he did, and the rest is history. Watts went on to become a prolific hymn writer, and is credited with writing 750 hymns, including the popular Christmas hymn, "Joy to the World." *Loch Lomond* by Jonathan Quick is a Scottish folk song, a story of love and sacrifice. In 1745 Prince Charles landed in Western Scotland and declared that he had come to reclaim his father's throne. Robert King, aged 72 at the time, and other young Jacobite soldiers joined the Prince's cause. But on October 18, 1746, Robert and the other Jacobites were captured and would be executed. The story told is that Robert volunteered his life to save the life of another young soldier. Thus, Robert's execution inspired the words of the folk song *Loch Lomond*. As the song would say, the young Jacobite soldier whom Robert saved "took the high road" (he went home) and Robert "took the low road" (was killed) but Robert was "in Scotland" (in spirit) "before ye" (before the younger man reached home), but "me and my true love would never meet again on the bonnie, bonnie banks o' Loch Lomond." *When the Trumpet Sounds* by Andre Thomas is an African American spiritual. The text reveals anticipation for the great judgment day. In his book, "Way Over in Beulah Land," Andre Thomas states that in 1998, the Library of Congress had on record more than 6,000 spirituals or fragments of spirituals. These songs were born from the trial and tribulation of Africans forced into slavery. Andre Thomas states, "It is amazing that out of man's inhumanity to man should come forth America's greatest art form." In the same book, Anton E. Armstrong writes, "These songs provide us with an inspiring treasury of songs filled with the human exploration of pain, pathos, hope, courage, faith, and freedom!" *Modimo*, written by Michael Barrett, is a song from South Africa. It is a song of praise and celebration. It uses a traditional Sesotho melody and improvised percussion.

*The Word Was God* is a sacred text, composed by an African American woman, Rosephanye Powell. *Orde-e* is a Madukayan folk song arranged by a Filipino woman, Maria Theresa Vizconde-Roldan. The authentic movements you will see us perform are an adaptation from the composer's own choir, on which she collaborated with Ms. Briggs for our choir's performance. The text portrays the peaceful sunrise in the mountainous region of the Cordilleras and the tranquility of the rice fields at sunrise. It is soon interrupted by the sounds of animals and children playing until serenity returns at sunset. *Lauda Sion* is a sacred text sung in Latin, composed by a Hungarian man, György Orbán. It is a song of praise associated with the feast of Corpus Christi, with lyrics written by St. Thomas Aquinas in the mid-13th century. *Liebst du um Schönheit* is a secular love song from the Romantic Period, sung in German, composed by a German woman, Clara Schumann. The lyrics are a melodramatic plea for true love. We will conclude with *Fire*, a contemporary composition by a Canadian woman, Katerina Gimon.

*Ad Astra* - to the stars - is highly rhythmic in both accompaniment and voices with independent vocal lines. The text in this piece, alternating between Latin "ad astra per aspera," or "through difficulties" and English, simply radiates energy with a message of hope and empowerment: "To the stars through difficulties, look upward, move forward, leave all cares behind."  
*O Bone Jesu*, by Marc' Antonio Ingegneri (c. 1535 or 1536-1592) and misattributed to Giovanni Pierluigi da Palestrina, was written in the Renaissance period in 1588. The translation of this piece written in Latin is "O good Jesus, have mercy upon us, for thou hast created us, for thou hast redeemed us by thy most precious blood." After the Storm, by Susan LaBarr (b. 1981), was written in homage to the city of Eagle, MO, the 2013 victim of a horrific tornado disaster. The text from a poem, *The Foundation* by Bill Caruso, a river boat rescuer who was part of the rescue team in the aftermath of this tornado, resonates profoundly in our world of all too frequent natural disasters. Listen to the difficult questions uttered throughout this piece. As the piece closes, the composer paints a musical collage of the ending sentiment of the poem as it suggests how to recover "one step at a time." *I Feel Tired Sometimes*, by Judy A. Rose (b. 1946). "I feel tired sometimes when the load is heavy" - is a newer original spiritual by local Portland composer and friend, Judy A. Rose. The text is palpable in the unsettled context of today's world that blends Renaissance era counterpoint using the Latin text, "Cum Sancto Spiritu in Gloria Dei Patris, Amen." The translation in English is, "With the Holy Spirit in the glory of God the Father." *Nyon Nyon*, by Jake Runestad (b. 1986), is an exploration of the effects that one can produce with the human voice. Runestad comments, "I created original words to achieve varieties of colors and mixed and matched them within the ensemble to produce a diverse sonic landscape. Incorporating effects similar to a flanger, wah-wah pedal, drum and bass, and synthesizers turns the choir into a full-fledged vocal orchestra."
