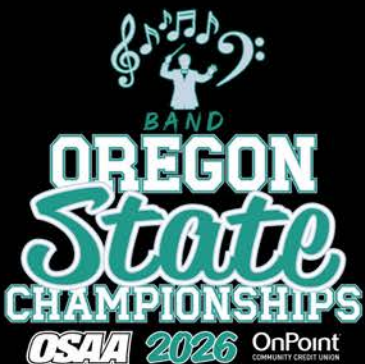

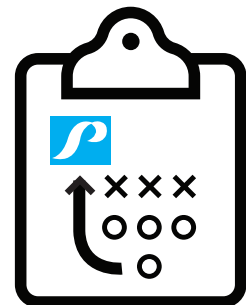

## About the OSAA

The OSAA is comprised of 301 member high schools representing more than 200 Oregon communities. A private non-profit, board-governed association, the OSAA is sanctioned by the Oregon State Board of Education and is a member of the National Federation of State High School Associations (NFHS).

## Its History

The OSAA began in 1918 when administrators from 36 schools recognized a need for an organization to coordinate and regulate high school interscholastic competition. Thus the Oregon State High School Athletic Association was formed. The name was changed in 1947 to reflect the inclusion of activities outside of traditional athletics.

## Mission Statement

The mission of the OSAA is to serve member schools by providing leadership and state coordination for the conduct of interscholastic activities, which will enrich the educational experiences of high school students. The OSAA will work to promote interschool activities that provide equitable participation opportunities, positive recognition and learning experiences to students, while enhancing the achievement of educational goals.

## What the OSAA Does

Much like the NCAA at the collegiate level, the OSAA regulates the eligibility and competition of all high school students in the state. This includes everything from determining which league a school will compete in to sponsoring and administering state championships.

## Funding

As a private, non-profit organization, the OSAA does not receive any state funding. Revenue is generated from three sources: school membership fees, state championship gate receipts and corporate sponsors.

## OSAA Activities

The OSAA sponsors 120 team and 426 individual event state championships for students competing in 20 interscholastic activities:

### Fall

Cross Country, Girls Volleyball, Soccer, Football

### Winter

Cheerleading, Wrestling, Swimming, Basketball, Dance/Drill

### Spring

Speech, Solo Music, Choir, Band/Orchestra  
Golf, Tennis, Boys Volleyball, Track & Field, Softball, Baseball

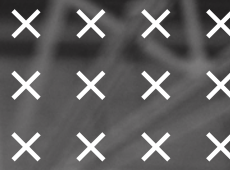

Morris's conducting and teaching are shaped by years of extensive performing experience as principal euphonium with the Boulder Brass and United States Marine Corps Band, Hawai'i. With these organizations he toured the United States, Australia, and Costa Rica as both an ensemble member and soloist.

**Dustin Barr** is the Director of Wind Studies and Associate Professor of Music at California State University, Fullerton, where he leads the university's comprehensive band program. He conducts the acclaimed University Wind Symphony and University Band, oversees the graduate wind conducting program, and teaches courses in conducting and music education. Prior experiences include appointments as Assistant Director of Bands at Michigan State University, Director of Bands at Mt. San Antonio College, and Assistant Director of Bands at Esperanza High School in Anaheim, California. A leading pedagogue in the field of conducting, Barr collaborated with theatre director Jerald Schwiebert to integrate performance theory with various movement disciplines, pioneering innovative approaches to conducting instruction. Their co-authored book, *Expressive Conducting: Movement and Performance Theory for Conductors* (Routledge, 2018), has become an essential resource for conductors worldwide. His work in movement theory has resulted in invitations to present masterclasses and lectures throughout the USA and in Spain. Moreover, his research on Scandinavian chamber wind ensemble music resulted in published editions of Asger Lund Christiansen's Octet, Op. 43 and Svend Schultz's Divertimento for Wind Octet.

Barr's accomplishments have garnered wide recognition, including winning Second Prize of the 2024 American Prize in Conducting and Second Prize of the 2024 American Prize in Collegiate Wind Band Performance. His leadership of the CSUF University Wind Symphony has resulted in prestigious performances at the College Band Directors National Association (CBDNA) conferences at both national (2019) and regional (2024) levels, as well as a headlining performance at the 2023 California All-State Music Education Conference. The University Wind Symphony's 2022 album, *Effigy*, is another noteworthy achievement. This album features the music of composer Brian Baumbusch and was the result of innovative musical practices and remote recording projects undertaken during the COVID-19 pandemic. Under Barr's direction, the ensemble also received Third Prize in the 2021 American Prize Ernst Bacon Award for the Performance of American Music.

Barr has guest conducted prominent ensembles, including the United States Army Band "Pershing's Own" and the United States Air Force Band of the Golden West, in addition to numerous collegiate bands across the country. Additionally, he has appeared as guest conductor of leading municipal bands in Spain. He holds a Doctor of Musical Arts in conducting from the University of Michigan, and both Master and Bachelor of Music degrees from California State University, Fullerton.

**Kim Roy**, versatile conductor and violist, is a native of Western Washington. Kim is the Music Director of Seattle Rock Orchestra, Sonic Pops NW, Fauntleroy Chamber Orchestra and Seattle Youth Symphony's (YSO) newest ensemble, Music Youth Southeast. She also manages chamber music programs for YSO and acts as a schools liaison for the Musical Pathways Project. This program supports Title 1 schools with non-string specialist teachers to uplift the student and teacher experience. As an enthusiastic educator, Kim has directed orchestra programs at Garfield High School, Renton High School and Dimmitt Middle School. Kim earned her Bachelors degree in Viola Performance from Central Washington University in 2007 and her Masters in Orchestral Conducting from Central in 2009. Through inspired classical performances and the fusion of the rock and classical genres, Kim brings a high level of energy and excitement to the orchestral music scene. Kim is currently listening to Harry Nilsson and Chopin.

**Vu Nguyen** is an associate professor of music and director of bands at University of the Pacific. He conducts the Pacific Wind Bands, and he teaches courses in conducting and music education. Nguyen maintains an active schedule as a clinician and has served as guest conductor with military bands as well

Prior to his appointment at Pacific, he served in similar roles at the University of Connecticut, University of Indianapolis, and Washington University in St. Louis. He began his teaching career in the San Ramon Valley Unified School District (CA). In addition to his academic career, Nguyen is a retired officer in the Air National Guard (ANG) where he was the commander and conductor of the ANG Band of the West Coast.

**Dr. Anna Jensen's** passion for music translates to her deep involvement in music education. In addition to instructing at the University of Puget Sound, she is the Executive Director of the Tacoma Youth Symphony Association. During the summer she teaches at The Evergreen Music Festival and The Hammond Ashley Bass Workshop. Dr. Jensen has also taught at Central Washington University, Pacific Lutheran University, Bowling Green State University, and was a graduate student instructor at the University of Michigan. In recent years, Dr. Jensen was awarded the *Outstanding Master Studio Teacher Award* from the American String Teachers Association, WA Chapter and the Washington State Music Educators Association "Friend of Music" award.

As a conductor, Dr. Jensen is a frequent clinician, adjudicator, and guest conductor for contests, festivals, and workshops across the Pacific Northwest, including Alaska. She has conducted numerous All-State orchestras, regional honor groups, summer music festival orchestras, and city-wide orchestra festivals. During the year, Dr. Jensen conducts the University of Puget Sound Symphony Orchestra, the Tacoma String Philharmonic at the Tacoma Youth Symphony Association, and is the Director of Orchestras at the Annie Wright Schools.

Dr. Jensen is the assistant principal bassist of Symphony Tacoma and regularly performs with orchestras and chamber ensembles across the region including the Paramount Theater Orchestra. She has performed with the Second City Chamber Music Series, the Icicle Creek Chamber Music Festival, the Kairos Music Festival and Lyceum, the Rackham Chamber Music Series, and the All Rivers at Once contemporary music series. Her vast interest in contemporary music has brought about numerous new chamber music works for the double bass and she has presented the world premieres of these works. She can be heard on William Bolcom's Grammy Award winning recording of his "Songs of Innocence and Experience", conducted by Leonard Slatkin.

Over the years, Dr. Jensen has been the featured double bass soloist with the Everett Philharmonic Orchestra, the Lake Chelan Bach Festival Orchestra, the Pacific Lutheran University Symphony Orchestra, the Wenatchee Symphony Orchestra, and the Tacoma Young Artists Orchestra. Dr. Jensen has won the Spokane Allied Arts Young Artist Competition, the Helen Snelling Crowe Competition, and was a finalist in the American String Teachers Association National Solo Competition.

Receiving her doctorate in musical arts degree in double bass performance at the University of Michigan, she studied with Dr. Diana Gannett and was a graduate student instructor. She holds degrees from the University of Michigan (DMA and MM) and Central Washington University (BM) and has been the recipient of the Mildred Tuttle Fellowship, the Farrell Merit Scholarship-Grant and was awarded the Presser Scholar. **Dr. Rebecca Phillips** is Professor of Music and Director of Bands at Colorado State University where she conducts the CSU Wind Symphony and guides all aspects of the band and graduate wind conducting programs. She has served as guest-conductor, clinician, and performer throughout North America, Europe, and Asia. Highlights include conductor-in-residence with the United States Navy Band in Washington, D.C., the Department of Defense All-Europe High School Honor Band in Frankfurt, Germany, guest-conducting the "The President's Own" United States Marine Band, and both professional and collegiate musicians in Prague (Czech Republic) for the "Prague Multicultural Music Project." In addition, she has conducted members of the Prague National Symphony at the inaugural "2017 American Spring Festival" (Prague, Czech Republic). In 2018, she conducted members of the Des Moines Symphony in a chamber concert for the Iowa Bandmasters Association annual conference.

Dr. Phillips regularly conducts intercollegiate and collegiate honor bands, all-state bands, and festival bands across the United States, Canada, and Europe and she has been a rehearsal clinician at the Midwest Clinic: *An International Band and Orchestra Conference*. In March 2025, her Colorado State University Wind Symphony traveled internationally on a performance tour of Spain (Madrid, Granada, Malaga) and ensembles under her direction have been featured at the 2020 Colorado Music Educators Association Convention, the 2019 American Bandmasters Association National Convention, the 2012 College Band Director's National Association Southern Division Conference, the 2010 Society of Composers International Conference, and the 2008 North American Saxophone Alliance International Convention.

Dr. Phillips believes in treasuring the traditional wind music of the past as well as promoting cutting edge works of today's finest composers. She commissioned and conducted world and consortium premieres of works by several leading composers, including William Bolcom, James David, John Mackey, John Fitz Rogers, Kevin Poelking, Adam Silverman, Frank Ticheli, and Dana Wilson to name a few. Her conducting performances of David del Tredici's *In Wartime* and John Mackey's *Redline Tango* are both featured on the nationally distributed Louisiana State University Wind Ensemble compact disc project and the world premiere of John Fitz Rogers *Narragansett* is featured on the Compact Disc *And I Await*, featuring Dr. Phillips as guest-conductor of the University of South Carolina Wind Ensemble.

As a trombonist, Dr. Phillips' performances can be found on several internationally distributed recordings. She has performed with the National Symphony Orchestra, U.S. Army Band (Pershing's Own), the Tallahassee Symphony, and the Tampa Bay Opera Orchestra. She has also performed internationally in England, Mexico, the Caribbean, Russia, and Sweden, and has toured as a trombonist with Johnny Mathis and Barry Manilow.

A native of the Washington, D.C. area, Dr. Phillips earned her Bachelor of Music Education degree from Florida State University, Master of Music degrees in conducting and trombone performance from the University of South Florida, and Doctor of Musical Arts in conducting at Louisiana State University. She served as a secondary school band director for seven years in Florida, including Director of Bands at Howard W. Blake Performing Arts High School in Tampa, Florida where she developed an award-winning concert band program. Prior to her appointment at CSU, she served as the Associate Director of Bands and Director of Athletic Bands at the University of South Carolina where she was responsible for directing the Symphonic Winds Concert Band, "The Mighty Sound of the Southeast" Carolina Marching Band, "Concocktion" Pep Bands, teaching undergraduate instrumental conducting, and directing the Carolina Summer Drum Major Clinic.

She is a Past President of the National Band Association, serves on the Board of Directors for the American Bandmasters Association, served in various capacities with the College Band Directors National Association, and is on the college/university board for the Western International Band Clinic.

**Myron Peterson** is Director of Bands and Instrumental Music Education at Boise State University. He holds a Doctor of Musical Arts from the University of Iowa, Master of Music from Colorado State University (both in wind conducting), and Bachelor of Music Education from the University of Northern Iowa. Peterson served in Iowa public schools for 23 years. His ensembles performed nationally in Iowa, Minnesota, Ohio, Indiana, New Jersey, Connecticut, Hawaii, Missouri, Washington, Idaho, and Nevada, including conference appearances for the College Band Directors National Association, Iowa Bandmasters Association, Idaho Music Educators Association, and this year's conference of the College Band Directors National Association Western/Northwestern Division.

**Stephen Meyer** is currently the Director of Bands and Associate Professor of Music at Northern Arizona University. He is also the music director for The Tempe Winds and on the conducting staff for the Phoenix Youth Symphony Orchestras. While at NAU, the Wind Symphony has been twice invited to perform at the College Band Directors National Association Regional Conference, and the Lumberjack Marching Band performed at the 2025 Macy's Thanksgiving Day Parade. Meyer previously served on the faculties of the Crane School of Music at SUNY Potsdam and the University of South Carolina. During his tenure as Director of Bands at Clear Creek High School, the Clear Creek Wind Ensemble was a featured performer at The Midwest Clinic (2013), a three-time National Winner in the National Wind Band Honors project, and a two-time national finalist for The American Prize in Wind Ensemble Performance. Before Clear Creek, Meyer taught at Harrison High School in Cobb County, Georgia, where he assisted with performances at The Midwest Clinic (2007), the Georgia Music Educators Association conference, and the University of Georgia. With Meyer as co-director of the marching band, the ensemble was a consistent Bands of America Regional and Super Regional Finalist, a BOA Grand National Finalist in 2007, and invited to perform at the Macy's Thanksgiving Day Parade in 2009. Meyer graduated magna cum laude from the Indiana University Jacobs School of Music with a bachelor's degree in music education. He earned a master's degree in music education and a doctorate in wind band conducting from the University of Michigan. Meyer is the author of *Rehearsing the High School Band*, volumes 1 and 2, *Rehearsing the Middle School Band*, and *Rehearsing the Marching Band*.

**Scott Hagen**, a third-generation band director, was born and raised in a small town in Minnesota and inspired early by his father, Donald Hagen. He earned a Bachelor of Music in Music Education and Trumpet Performance from Concordia College (1977) and later a Master of Arts in Music Education from the University of Minnesota (1991), studying with nationally respected educators. Hagen joined the University of Utah in 1991 as Marching Band Director and was appointed Director of Bands in 2002, a role in which he led ensembles to national prominence. Under his direction, the Marching and Pep Bands performed in numerous Bowl Games, the Final Four, and National Championship events, while the University of Utah Wind Ensemble performed at the MENC Conference, the CBDNA Western Division Conference, and the Utah Music Educators Association Conference. He also conducted the Olympic Spirit Band during the 2002 Winter Olympics in Salt Lake City.

A founding member, Music Director, and Conductor of the Utah Wind Symphony (2010–2019), Hagen led the ensemble to a 2014 Midwest Clinic performance with renowned guest soloists. He conducted world premieres of David Maslanka's Concerto for Clarinet and Wind Ensemble (2016) and Symphony No. 10 (2018) and oversaw the recording of *The Music of David Maslanka Vols. 2–4*, released by Mark Custom Records. Known for cultivating a warm, rich, and distinctive ensemble sound, Hagen's influence extends well beyond the podium through over 300 clinics, All-State and Honor Band engagements nationwide, and the success of his many former students now teaching across the country. He retired in 2020 as Professor Emeritus, was elected into the UMEA Hall of Fame in 2022. Scott remains active as a guest conductor and clinician nationally while having much more time to enjoy time with his family.

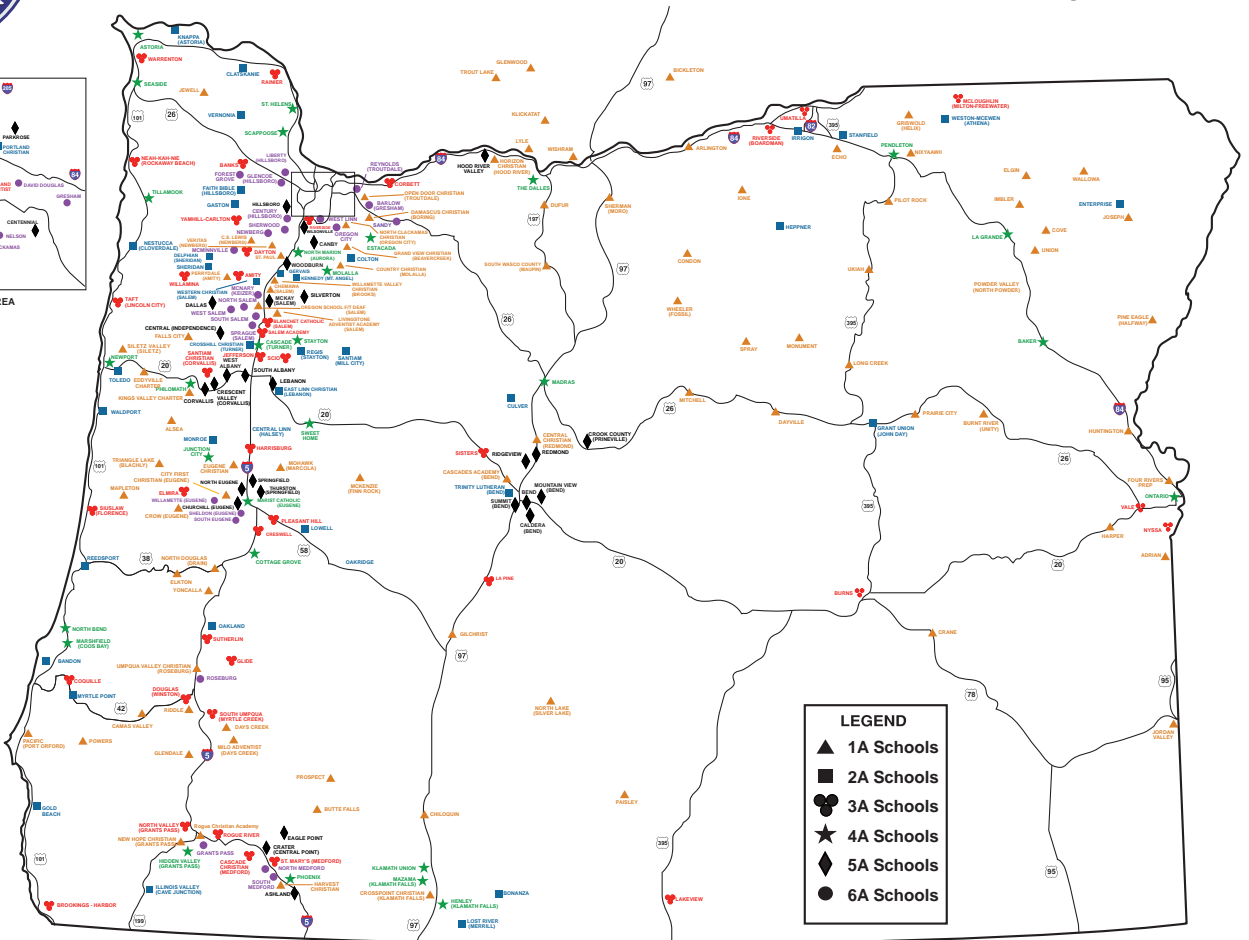
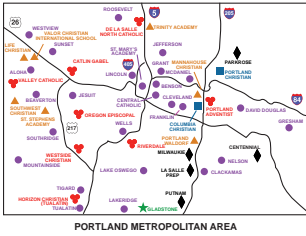
